## Key HHS Programs Serving Seniors and Persons with Disabilities As of December 17, 2019 (Dollars in Millions)

This chart focuses on the proposals contained within the FY2020 Final Budget deal, which was negotiated between both parties in the House and Senate and formally released on December 16, 2019. In the chart below, numbers in green indicate a proposal that would increase funding compared to the FY2019 enacted levels and numbers in red indicate a decrease. Given the bipartisan, bicameral negotiations involved in this proposal, it is expected to become law.
