History and Unique Characteristics

- Created in response to quality problems in nursing homes
- Distinct from other programs administered by State agencies
- Statewide
- Full-time Ombudsman heads the Office of the State LTC Ombudsman
- Specific functions requiring <u>independence and autonomy</u>
- Duties require good working relationships among agencies
- 2015 regulation to create *greater alignment and consistency* across the country

Statutory Support for Systems Advocacy

Older Americans Act Section 712 – Functions of the Ombudsman

712(a)(3)(G)

- (i) <u>analyze, comment on, and monitor</u> the development and implementation of Federal, State, and <u>local laws, regulations</u>, and other governmental <u>policies and actions</u>, that pertain to the <u>health</u>, <u>safety, welfare, and rights</u> of the residents, with respect to the <u>adequacy of long-term care facilities and services</u> in the State;
- (ii) <u>recommend any changes in such laws, regulations, policies, and</u> <u>actions</u> as the Office determines to be appropriate; and
- (iii) <u>facilitate public comment</u> on the laws, regulations, policies, and actions;

Statutory Support for Systems Advocacy (2) 712(a)(5)(B)(v) – Duties of designated representatives

 <u>review</u>, and if necessary, <u>comment on</u> any existing and proposed <u>laws</u>, <u>regulations</u>, <u>and other government policies and</u> <u>actions</u>, that pertain to the <u>rights and well-being</u> of residents; and

 facilitate the <u>ability of the public to comment</u> on the laws, regulations, policies, and actions;

Statutory Support for Systems Advocacy (3) 712(h) – The State agency shall require the Office to—

Prepare an **Annual Report**—

- (a) <u>describing the activities</u> carried out by the Office in the year for which the report is prepared;
- (b) <u>containing and analyzing</u> the <u>data collected</u>;
- (c) <u>evaluating the problems</u> experienced by, and the <u>complaints</u> made by or on behalf of, residents;
- (d) containing recommendations for-
 - (i) improving quality of the care and life of the residents; and
 - (ii) protecting the health, safety, welfare, and rights of the residents;

Statutory Support for Systems Advocacy (4) 712(h) – The State agency shall require the Office to—

- (2) <u>analyze, comment on, and monitor</u> the development and implementation of Federal, State, and local <u>laws, regulations</u>, and other government <u>policies and actions</u>... and <u>recommend any changes</u> in such laws, regulations, and policies <u>as the Office determines</u> to be appropriate;
- (3)(A) <u>provide such information</u> as the <u>Office determines</u> to be necessary <u>to public and private agencies</u>, <u>legislators</u>, <u>and other persons</u>, regarding—
- (i) the <u>problems and concerns</u> of individuals residing in long-term care facilities; and
 - (ii) recommendations related to the problems and concerns;

Regulatory Support for Systems Advocacy

- 45 CFR 1324.11(e)(5)
 - Requires <u>policies and procedures</u> developed by the State
 Ombudsman or by the agency housing the Office <u>based on</u>
 <u>Ombudsman recommendations</u>
 - Must assure that the Office is required and has <u>sufficient</u>
 <u>authority</u> to carry out responsibility to <u>analyze</u>, <u>comment on</u>, <u>and</u>
 <u>monitor laws</u>, <u>regulations</u>, <u>and government policies and actions</u>

Regulatory Support for Systems Advocacy (2)

- 45 CFR 1324.11(e)(5)
 - <u>Exclude</u> Ombudsman and representatives from <u>State lobbying prohibitions</u>
 - (ii) <u>Nothing shall prohibit</u> the Ombudsman or the State agency or other agency in which the Office is organizationally located <u>from establishing</u> <u>policies</u> which <u>promote consultation</u> regarding the <u>determinations</u> of the Office related to <u>recommended changes</u> in laws, regulations, and policies.
 - However, such a policy <u>shall not require a right to review or pre-approve</u> positions or communications of the Office.

Regulatory Support for Systems Advocacy (3) 45 CFR 1324.13(a)(7) – Functions and responsibilities

Additional responsibilities

- Provide <u>leadership to statewide systems advocacy</u> including coordination of efforts by representatives
- Provide <u>information to public and private agencies</u>, <u>legislators</u>, <u>the</u>
 <u>media</u>, <u>and other persons</u>, regarding the problems and concerns of
 residents and recommendations
- Determinations and positions <u>shall be those of the Office</u> and <u>shall</u> <u>not necessarily represent</u> the determinations or position of the State agency or other agency


Regulatory Support for Systems Advocacy (4) 45 CFR 1324.13(g) – Annual report

- The Ombudsman shall <u>independently develop and provide final</u> <u>approval</u> of an annual report
- Contain *policy, regulatory, and/or legislative recommendations* for improving quality...
- Shall make report available to the public and submit it to ACL, governor, state legislature, survey agency, and others

- Technical assistance
 - FAQ
 - ACL reviews
 - Ombudsman Resource Center/ADvancing States Primer
 - On-going discussions as needed
- Corrective action plans
- Final rule to be a catalyst for additional reviews and TA
